REPORT FROM THE CHHA BOARDROOM

The Canadian Hard of Hearing Association has grown and matured since it was founded in 1982. The objective at that time was to meet a need not addressed by any other organization in Canada – the needs of the hard of hearing community.

Today, it is still the only national voice of hard of hearing people in Canada. The first CHHA conference, A Sound Beginning, took place in Toronto, in 1983.

Twenty five years later, in July 2008, CHHA was hosting the IFHOH/CHHA International Congress, “A Global Community of Communication”, and welcoming the world and over 560 delegates to what turned out to be a world-class event in Vancouver with 26 countries represented.

CHHA National is very ready to take on new challenges as we move ahead within a difficult world economy. At the 2009 CHHA Conference in St Johns, NL, the membership had the foresight to take pro-active measures in anticipation of upcoming cutbacks and restraints, the winds of change were blowing and CHHA has met the challenge head on.

At first, this all seemed a bit confusing and even overwhelming at times – like one giant puzzle that needed to be pieced together – however it is taking the shape of a beautiful picture as the pieces fall into place. CHHA National has accomplished a great deal under very difficult circumstances as the winds of change kept blowing. Old methods needed cleaning up, difficult decisions were made, and new beginnings led to new initiatives and processes. In many ways, we are still working on the first part of the puzzle – gathering the pieces and ensuring a good fit on the way forward – but the picture is emerging and this Board is determined to ensure that all pieces of the puzzle will fall in place. We hope that you will enjoy and approve of the initiatives we have created for this conference as a first step to what can be expected in the coming years as our sails are set towards the future.

The Poster Presentation activity introduced at CHHA National Conference 2011 in Yellowknife, NWT, is one of the first steps towards concrete results through membership involvement – it is part of the roadmap linked to the strategic planning effort. As a Board we “do our homework” before moving ahead with making decisions that affect you. This requires research, consultations with those directly affected, getting feedback and substantiating decisions on the basis of the membership’s comments and concerns. Consultations, inclusiveness, and openness with respect to the membership are crucial to sound decision making. This will be done through surveys and consultation sessions to ensure that the projects, committees and initiatives that CHHA National implements truly answer your needs. The Disability Tax Credit initiative, the Walk2Hear fundraiser and the Access 2020 Coalition on Captioning working alongside the CRTC are all great examples of what can be done with team effort. Check out the Poster Presentations to learn more about what CHHA is working on and volunteer your time and energy. I am sure you will enjoy the experience and will gain a lot from it.

Over the next two years, the CHHA National Board of Directors will necessarily focus on two main issues: fundraising initiatives and the establishment of more coalitions with other organizations that share our vision.

Fundraising is a very important issue that will need our utmost attention. The Walk2Hear fundraising initiative is fully functional; thanks to last year's pilot the bumps in the road have been smoothed out and it should be clear sailing from here on. It is important to understand that Walk2Hear is principally designed for the benefit of Branches, Chapters and Networks, and not so much for National. It takes some time and effort but those extra dollars do count and will help bring local branches, for example, to the forefront within their own community while raising awareness of hearing loss issues among the general public. The CHHA National Office is always happy to discuss Walk2Hear – you will be amazed at how simple it can be! The next step is to turn our attention towards the future of CHHA National and focus on fundraising that will ensure long term funding and philanthropy on a national level. Yes, like with any fundraising initiative, these will be labour intensive at the beginning but they will eventually become self-sustaining and very rewarding.

Last but not least is the forming of coalitions with like-minded organizations. Issues such as newborn infant screening, acoustics in the schools, accreditation standards for hospitals, clinics and service providers, captioning in public entertainment venues, ensuring adequate numbers of well trained captionists.....and the list goes on – these are areas that concern us all. Such issues are also a great concern for professionals who support the hard of hearing community such as the Canadian Academy of Audiologists, the Canadian Academy of Speech Language Pathologists and Audiologists, and other groups such as VOICE who advocate for children and their parents, the Canadian Hearing Society, the Hearing Foundation and many others. It is said that there is strength in numbers, there is also the funding issue – by joining forces with other organizations our credibility, visibility and funding opportunities are increased. There is a lot of work to be done in this area and every effort will be made over the next two years to build bridges with these organizations as we move towards making this country more accessible for Canadians living with hearing loss.

When I accepted the role of CHHA National President, my personal goal was to develop communication and decision making tools that would ensure good governance, open and frequent feedback and participation, clear and defined roles and responsibilities and actions focused on positive results. Yes, the winds of change have been calling at CHHA. All of the Board is striving to meet this challenge and open the doors for those living with hearing loss and for future generations. That is our vision as we prepare to celebrate next year our 30 years of helping Canadians across the country who live and work with hearing loss.

PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS - REPORTS

CapTel: CHHA has sought in the past year to bring captioned telephone service to Canada made by an American company. The service is already available in 49 of 50 states. A petition was placed online on CHHA's website and a link to this site was promoted via email and magazine articles to CHHA membership and friends of CHHA. To date over 700 petitions have been collected. CHHA promoted the service by meeting or corresponding with representatives of Bell Canada, Rogers, Telus, Shaw and CRTC. Access 2020 Coalition: The Access 2020 Coalition is an ever-expanding group of disability organizations sharing the common goal of 100% accessible content across all broadcast distribution platforms by 2020. The Access 2020 Coalition continuously makes presentations to regulatory and Parliamentary bodies and disseminates information about accessibility in the electronic media. CHHA is an active member of this coalition which is seeing success in 2011 due to its efforts in 2010. For more information on Access 2020 Coalition visit <http://www.mediac.ca/proj-Access2020.asp>

Employment Project: Our employment services project (Creating Successful Partnerships) ended its 3 yr funding under the Opportunities Fund for Persons with Disabilities. The Project was not renewed by the Opportunities Fund and all our clients were referred to other agencies wherever possible. During its three (3) year run, the project developed a training program, updated and re-printed our handbook Working with Hearing Loss and saw the following results: 167 Clients were served; 162 received enhanced employability training; 95 found employment; 30 participants returned to school. Liberated Learning: Hosted Transcription Service is part of the Liberated Learning Youth Initiative involving universities and various associations. Funded by Canada's Social Development Partnerships Program, the Youth Initiative empowers post secondary students with disabilities in Canada. We are looking for individuals to participate in testing HTS. Participants will receive user accounts to permit uploading of previously inaccessible recorded lectures and receive a speech recognition generated transcript. How this system works: record your lecture; upload the audio to (HTS) WHICH will transcribe IT into a multi-media transcript, giving you the most accurate study notes possible. CHHA is also piloting several speech recognition enabled applications that will eventually give the hard of hearing community better access to information. Many volunteers are working with our National office staff to use speech recognition for face to face communication, instant messaging, and other daily activities. The goal is to inform members how such emerging technologies enhance accessibility in education, the workplace, and social environments. Speech Recognition technology promises to be a solution for automatically captioning and transcribing various multimedia. The Big Blue Button - an Online Teleconference (with captions): The Canadian Hard of Hearing Association is working to allow the staff and Board to communicate in real-time, see each other, and share documents. Ultimately this web conferencing technology and appropriate business model should help the entire hard of hearing community. The goal of this project funded by Coral CEA is to evaluate the feasibility of a captioned web conferencing service and make it widely available thus allowing a cheaper alternative to face to face meetings.

Walk2Hear: The goal of the Walk2hear was to develop fundraising activities to support the programs and services of organization. In 2010 we held a fundraising walkathon that took place on October 3, 2010. A strong emphasis was placed on finding national as well as local sponsors. A secondary goal of this venture was to help our branches and chapters learn to fundraise by developing a 'how to' handbook. The 2010 Walk2Hear was very successful and had over 250 walkers, ten local sponsors, 4 National Sponsors, and raised \$58,000. We also developed a Walk2Hear Guidebook to help our branches plan an event. In 2011, Walk2Hear will take place in Ottawa (ON)/Gatineau (QC), Newmarket (ON), and Vancouver (BC). Social Networks- CHHA - Facebook: The main objective of this project was to open a channel of communication for the hard of hearing community using existing networks such as Facebook that allows our community to share common interests. Promotional Material: In 2010 the National Office revised our Speech Reading DVD: Sound Ideas. A new interactive menu was inserted and the graphics of the Guide book and DVD cover were updated. Our office has also been involved in developing new corporate brochures with the help of a Board Committee. We hope that the new corporate brochures will be ready in the fall of 2011. Lastly corporate pens and note pads were developed to help our Donor drive and Hearing Awareness month promotion.

Ask the Expert: In 2010 we developed an interactive feature to our national website that we called Ask the Expert. Questions from our web readers are automatically sent to an expert panel covering many different topics and issues. The questions are monitored by CHHA staff to ensure they are answered in a timely fashion. In 2010 we answered over 437 questions. Disability Tax Credit: CHHA and its partners is seeking revision to current criteria used for the Disability Tax Credit related to people with a hearing loss. A Petition was placed online on CHHA's website and promoted via email and magazine articles to CHHA membership and friends of CHHA. The revisions were brought to Parliament as Bill C-577 but the Bill died when the National Election was called and will need to be re-submitted. Listen/Écoute Magazine: CHHA's official publication continues to be produced three times a year. CHHA Membership: Between January 1 and December 31, 2010, CHHA has seen 1,007 memberships purchased and has a current membership base of 1,948 active members. These figures represent a slight decrease in membership as a whole. The national membership has decreased by 1.1% over last year's figures. The economic downturn still plays a major factor in our membership numbers. As the economy improves, we hope to see these figures increase. In addition, it is hoped that our national fundraiser (Walk2Hear) and our national conference in Yellowknife will help increase public awareness of our association and as a result our membership numbers should also increase.

This year, IFHOH has been working closely with the International Disability Alliance in Geneva. This work is focused on promoting the human rights of persons with disabilities around the world, using instruments such as the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities.

Former CHHA National President, Dr. Ruth Warick was elected President of IFHOH at its Biennial General Meeting in Stockholm, Sweden on June 20, 2010, replacing former IFHOH President, Jan-Peter Strömgren (Sweden). IFHOH is working hard at making the whole world a better place for persons who are hard of hearing – a worthy cause that we are all passionate about!

CHHA National is a General Member Organization of IFHOH, and my role is to ensure liaison between both organizations. To further highlight the interest of Canadians in IFHOH, I took on the role of Editor of the IFHOH Journal.
